Welcome to the APS-2010 Seed Exchange. **Our profound thanks to all donors.** The '10 list shows the location where wild seed was collected. If no location is given, assume a garden source. Be sure to list plenty of substitutes with your requests. Requests will be filled on a first come – first served basis. All requests must be received on or before March 1, 2011. Unless noted otherwise, garden seed is open-pollinated. Characteristics of offspring are unpredictable, especially if there are closely-related penstemons nearby. Even wild-collected taxa may show natural variation. This is part of the excitement of growing from seed. Although it was recommended to cull out the oldest seed this year, we still have a good offering of older seed and urge you to select from this list as well as from the 2010 donations.

Please request by both name and number. Be sure to include your mailing address, carefully-printed. Donors of seed receive one packet free for each different donation they make. All non-free packets are still US \$0.50 each. You may send US currency but we would prefer checks payable to the American Penstemon Society. Please do not make checks or Paypal payments to me personally! Everyone is limited to no more than 20 packets. All overseas members are permitted 10 free packets.
